Marriage

Couples preparing for matrimony must be parishioners of St. Patrick and consult a priest before setting a marriage date. If a couple is not registered at St. Patrick and has a true desire to become active long-term parishioners, they need to introduce themselves to the pastor, fill out a registration form, and attend Mass at St. Patrick for six months before a marriage date can be discussed.

Baptism

Parents must be practicing Catholics. If you wish to have your child baptized, please call the rectory.

Letter of Recommendation

A parishioner known by a St. Patrick's priest and registered with the parish for three months can receive a letter of recommendation stating their eligibility to become a godparent in a baptism or a sponsor in a confirmation at another parish.
